LOCAL TVET GRADUATES GET SUPPORT FROM TOP GLOVE

The MOU signing ceremony was held at Top Glove Tower, Shah Alam marking the beginning of five-year cooperation between the Company and MOE; aimed at advancing TVET in Malaysia, increasing the nation's employment rate, and promoting the development of a knowledge-based economy.

Dato Dr Mah Hang Soon, Deputy Minister I of the Ministry of Education says, "The government is expecting to pick the amount of high competitive skills.

"Usually we only give three years of the partnership but with Top Glove, we give five, to anticipate enhancement of the TVET industry. I am honoured to witness this memorandum with the vision it will develop job training, job knowledge, and practices for future generations."

Top Glove strides towards boosting the knowledge workforce through collaborations such as with MOE and with public and private TVET institutions.

Top Glove Managing Director Dato Lee Kim Meow says, "Top Glove will continue to provide gainful employment and lifelong education and training to bright, young Malaysians while endeavouring to advance a knowledge economy which is key to supporting the Government's aim of achieving a high-income nation," added Dato' Lee.

In FY2021, Top Glove had hired 2,460 TVET graduates consisting of 340 staff, 800 interns, and 1,320 local workers. The Company is looking towards employing 2000 TVET graduates for FY2022.
