Top Glove has been extremely active in its Environmental, Social, and Governance initiatives, and looks like the efforts have been recognised by the global rating house Standard & Poor, the world's largest glove-maker has been included for the first time in the very exclusive Sustainability Yearbook 2022 by S&P Global.

The Company is one of 53 Industry Movers in the 2022 Yearbook which is regarded as one of the world's most comprehensive publications providing in-depth analysis on corporate sustainability. It is based on companies across various industries assessed in the S&P Global Corporate Sustainability Assessments, which is the basis for the S&P Global ESG Score.

The ESG Score is also the basis for inclusion in the Dow Jones Sustainability Indices. Companies within the top 15 percent of each industry that participated in the CSA last year and this year, that achieved an improvement in their S&P Global ESG Score of at least 5 per cent, and accomplished the strongest improvement in their industry, are awarded an Industry Mover Sustainability Award.

Top Glove was named among the top 10 percent in the Health Care Equipment & Supplies industry category globally in the CSA as at the score date of 12 November 2021; a rather commendable increase from the previous year when it stood among the top 19 percent of its peers.

To be listed in the Yearbook, companies must be within the top 15 percent of their industry and achieve a score within 30 percent of their industry's top-performing companies. As a result of these stringent criteria, only 716 companies across 61 industries were successfully listed in the 2022 yearbook.
